

TEACH Admission Requirements

(effective Fall 2024)

The TEACH program at Our Lady of the Lake University is a three-semester program including clinical teaching in the final semester before graduation, which lasts 14 weeks or 70 days of full-day class placements.

Certifications Offered

CORE Early Childhood – Grade 6 Certification

Foundation Requirements

Foundation requirements for teacher candidates who pursue a B.S. in Interdisciplinary Studies with a specialization(s) in EC- 6, Special Education, ESL, and/or Bilingual Education, who are seeking Core Subjects EC-6 certification must be completed **before** admission to Teacher Education (must have a "C" or better in each of these foundation courses) [19 TAC 227.10(a)4]: To not delay a student's graduation and with the consent of Education Department faculty advisor, a student may have **one class** from the foundation list that is not complete and must be completed by the deadline listed in the TEACH admission decision letter.

Professional Education Requirements

Students must take or be in progress to have at least eight out of 12 courses (listed below). For example, a student can be enrolled in two or three classes listed below during the semester they apply for TEACH but must earn a "C" or better in 8 courses to be formally admitted into TEACH. Unofficial transcripts via Colleague will be checked at the start of the admission semester to remain enrolled in the professional education block(s).

EC-6 Certification Electives 6 hours Students seeking only EC-6 certification must select 6 hours of additional Education Electives in EDUCATION or SPECIAL EDUCATION listed above. Additionally, EC-6 students may only earn one D in PHIL, Foreign Language, or THSA if the cumulative GPA (Grade Point Average) requirement is met. These three courses fulfill General Education requirements and are not considered "content" courses per TEA.

Grades 7 - 12 Single-Content/All-Level Certification

Foundation Requirements

Foundation requirements for teacher certification candidates who pursue a B.A. in a Major/Area of Concentration seeking 7-12 certification or All –Level Certification must be completed before admission to Teacher Education (must have a "C" or better in each of these foundation courses [19 TAC 227.10(a)4)]: In an effort not to delay a student's graduation and with consent of Education Department faculty advisor, a student may have one class from the foundation list that is not in their certification content area and this course must be completed by the deadline listed in the TEACH admission decision letter.

PLUS Required Content Courses

- □ English, History, Music, P.E., Art, & Spanish must have 12 hours overall from their content area.
- □ Math majors must have 15 hours overall from MATH
- □ Science majors must have 15 hours overall from BIO, CHEM, and PHYS

Professional Education Requirements

Students must earn a "C" or better in at least 7 out of 10 courses listed below and from the student's degree plan. For example, a student can be enrolled in two or three classes listed below during the semester they apply for TEACH but must earn a "C" or better in a total of 7 courses to be formally admitted into TEACH. Unofficial transcripts via Colleague will be checked at the start of the admission semester to remain enrolled in the professional education block(s).

7-12 or All-Level candidates seeking certification in Art, Music, PE/KINE, and Science may only earn one D in PHIL or THSA if the cumulative GPA requirement is met. These two courses fulfill G.E. requirements and are not considered "content" courses per TEA.

Advanced Planning for The Professional Education Courses

Professional education courses may not be taken until you are officially admitted to the teacher education program. This is a threesemester sequence. The final semester is 6 hours of clinical teaching. Students may ONLY take 9 hours this semester, so please plan. These courses are often offered during the day, requiring observations or field experience hours in a school.

Requirements for Admittance in Teacher Education (TEACH) Program

- A minimum institutional and cumulative G.P.A. of 2.75
- No grade lower than a "C" is acceptable in any transfer courses, and completion of all foundation courses
- A clear national Criminal Background Check
- An interview by Education Department faculty and staff [19 TAC 227.10(a)(8)]
- Demonstrate basic skills in reading, written communication, and mathematics by TSIA requirements below per 19 TAC 227.10 (a)(6) stated. TSIA: Reading 351, Math 350, Writing (essay) 5 or Writing at 340 plus essay score of 4 OR placement score less than 340 with a diagnostic score of at least a 4
- International applicants must earn minimum scaled scores on the Test of English as a Foreign Language internet-Based Test (TOEFL iBT) of 24 for speaking, 22 for listening, 22 for reading, and 21 for writing [19 TAC 227.10(a)(7)].

19 TAC 227.10 (a)(6) An applicant must demonstrate basic skills in reading, written communication, and mathematics by meeting the requirements of the Texas Success Initiative under the rules established by the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board (THECB) in Part 1, Chapter 4, Subchapter C, of this title (relating to Texas Success Initiative), including one of the requirements established by §4.54 of this title (relating to Exemptions, Exceptions, and Waivers). *Passing Standards for Placement Testing and/or College Transcripts for college readiness per TAC §4.54b exemptions*.

Formal admission into the TEACH program requires the completion and submission of the following portfolio items on the TEACH Blackboard template prior to admission. An incomplete portfolio may result in a denial of an interview.:

- □ Apply for your TEA ID number on TEAL website
- □ Completed TEACH application
- □ Copy of your current degree audit showing: (EDUC Dept prints this out, DO NOT SUBMIT)
 - A minimum of 60 accrued credit hours (junior-level standing)
 - Minimum grade point average of 2.75
 - Transfer courses
 - Completion of required foundation courses with a grade of a C or higher (foundation courses vary by certification)
- D Philosophy of Education statement; must be typed and should be representative of your best writing skills
- A personal resume that chronologically documents examples of your fitness for teaching and/or your having spent time working with children and/or others, such as scholarships or awards, work history, outstanding projects in courses, or activities that display evidence relating to your interaction with children and/or others
- A copy of an OLLU Criminal Background Check Application and associated \$10 fee, including a \$35 TEA Technology Fee (\$45 payable on TEACH Marketplace link https://marketplace.ollusa.edu/TEACHapp
- □ Clear Criminal Background Check Approval
- □ Copy of your current Driver's License or State ID
- □ Signed FERPA Consent to Release Agreement
- □ Signed Texas Educators Code of Ethics
- □ Signed Criminal History Policy Acknowledgement Form
- □ Signed OLLU Risk Assessment Form (good for five years)
- □ Signed Professional Practices and Responsibilities
- □ Signed Handbook Acknowledgment Form
- Assessment scores that show basic skills in reading, math, and writing. This can be done by using one of the assessments listed in the Student Success Initiative chart (refer to the chart above) or by presenting college transcripts demonstrating satisfactory completion of college-level coursework. Exemptions under TAC \$4.54 include English Literature for Reading, English Composition for Writing, and College Algebra for Math.
- □ 45-minute timed writing prompt done in class or with Certification Officer
- □ Two Faculty Recommendations from current OLLU faculty
- □ Interview with Education Faculty. Once all application documents have been submitted.
- □ Transcript Request Form

Following 19 TAC 227.17, all applicants will receive a formal letter indicating the admission decision.

AFTER Admission into TEACH

- 🗆 The candidate must earn a C or better in all supporting & professional education courses & maintain a GPA of 2.75
- □ Baseline testing for Content, STR (only EC-6), and Supplementals

Scholarship Opportunities & Financial Support for Education Majors

Raising Texas Teachers Scholarship Program OLLU was identified as a premier Texas teacher preparation program and will receive from \$200,000 to \$1 million+ annually to support selected candidates who are awarded the Charles Butt Scholarship for Aspiring Teachers. Teaching fellows selected as Charles Butt Scholars will be awarded \$8,000 per year for up to four years. Applicants must be full-time OLLU education majors, Texas residents, have a strong academic record and history of achievement, and be committed to teaching in high-needs Texas public schools upon graduation. Federal TEACH Grant is for full-time education students with a minimum 3.25 GPA. Candidates must agree to teach a highly needed subject in a low-income area with a shortage of specific subject teachers in an elementary or secondary school. Candidates awarded a grant are eligible for up to \$4,000 a year while pursuing education certification in a high-need field. Upon graduation, you must teach at a low-income school (Title I campus) for at least four years.

- Bilingual Education and English Language Acquisition
- Foreign language
- Mathematics
- Science
- Special Education
